

(In military tradition, the Last Post is the bugle call that signifies the end of the day's activities. It is also sounded at military funerals to indicate that the soldier has gone to his final rest and at commemorative services)

ONE MINUTE'S SILENCE - a sign of respect and a time for reflection, concluding with 8 bells. Rung by Mr. Garry Marks. Treasurer & Librarian, The Bankstown & Yagoona Brass (Signaling the conclusion of the one minute's silence, 8 Bells will toll which is recognised on board ships as 'the end of watch' but is also a way of saying, a Sailors or Merchant Mariners own watch is over...a nautical euphemism for "finished". The MNWMF thanks the Bankstown City Band for arranging the 8 Bells).

(After the one minute's silence and 8 bells, flags are raised from half mast to the masthead as the Rouse is sounded. Today it is associated with the Last Post at all military funerals, and at services of dedication and remembrance).

# THE MERCHANT NAVY WAR MEMORIAL FUND STRATEGIC PLAN 2025–2027

# MAJOR PROJECTS TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE IN THE CONTINUED RECOGNITION OF THE AUSTRALIAN MERCHANT NAVY AND OF ITS VITAL IMPORTANCE TO THE NATION'S PROSPERITY

- (i) Encouragement of the next generation, to take up our and our predecessors' passion and commitment to ensure the future Australian Merchant Navy recognition is as secure in the future as in the past and the present. We remain highly committed to continuing to work in what we believe is the best interests of our cherished Merchant Navy veterans and the wider Australian maritime community.
- (ii) Continuing promotion & installation of the Merchant Navy emblem on existing war memorials throughout Australia.

Addition of Merchant Navy badge on St Andrews Village Memorial Bravery Garden, Ballina NSW opened on 15-10-2022 and co-funded by MNWMF.



- (iii) Equal recognition of the Merchant Navy Ensign on National Flag Day – 3rd September annually, which is also Merchant Navy Day.
- (iv) Submission to NSW Government via Premier The Hon. Chris Minns, MP, for the re-instatement of the Merchant Navy Ensign on the top of the Sydney Harbour Bridge, or failing that, on the bridge pylons on Merchant Navy Day, 3rd September annually.
- (v) Additional recognition of the role of the Merchant Navy within the Australian War Memorial (AWM).





- (vi) Establish a protocol with AWM that on Australian National Flag Day/Merchant Navy Day (3 Sept annually) that:
  - (a) The Red Ensign be flown with the Australian National Flag above the AWM: and
  - (b) Merchant Navy representative be among those laying wreaths at the Last Post Ceremony on 3rd September, that takes place at approx. 4.45pm AEDT in the commemorative courtyard.



(vii) Support the AWM "Places of Pride" launched by AWM in November 2018 to record all memorials throughout Australia on the national register.
